



"Be careful, don't go far away and be home before dark."


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





"Hello, hello, hello!"







How many of your friends are your peers?










Papuduk got very tired but it finally saw the sun at the end of the tunnel. It started to wander among the cages without getting caught by anyone.






Next Papuduk ran to the other cage.


The moment it saw the small elephant there, it realised that it was Raja. It was going back and forth between the wall and the rails.










The next day the attendants did not know what to do when they came to the zoo and found all the cages empty. They left the zoo with no animals as it was and went home, never to return.






Since we have found a name for the museum, we can pass to the next stage.




We need such an information panel for our museum also, but our panel will be a little bit different.




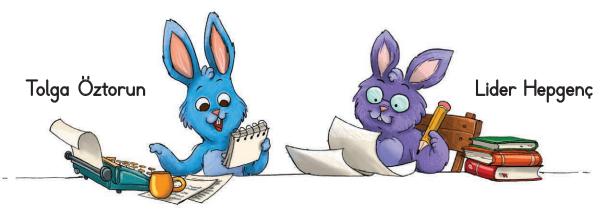
